Mrs. Cheryl Darlene Brannon, 72, formerly of Lebanon, went to meet Jesus face to face on Monday, May 18, 2020 at Christ Hospital in Cincinnati, Ohio. She was born in Lebanon, Indiana, on January 31, 1948; a daughter of the late Robert C. and Joan (Harris) Ranney.

A long-time resident of Boone County, she attended Pinnell High School and was a 1966 graduate of Granville Wells.

Darlene was previously married to Jim Dinsmore, and Michael Shearer. Michael preceded her in death in 1996. She married William "Bill" "Smoke" Brannon, on April 22, 1999; he survives.

She was a certified nurse assistant and a certified social services advocate at Springfield Nursing Home in Indianapolis, prior to retirement. She attended The Ark Church in Miamisburg, Ohio.
