Agnes Rose Strong, 89, passed away on July 14, 2019 at her home in Zionsville. She was born on August 29, 1929 in Manhattan, New York; a daughter of the late Louis William and Antoinette Marie (Hudecek) Feyh.

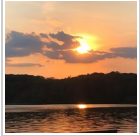
