Mr. Bobby L. Halford, 70, passed away Thursday evening, January 4, 2018, at Homewood Health Campus in Lebanon. He was born in Stuttgart, Arkansas, on January 19, 1947, a son of the late Eddie L. and Norma J. (Abney) Halford.

On June 15, 1968, he married Marilyn K. (McClaine) Halford in Lebanon, she survives and this year would have marked their 50th wedding anniversary.

Bobby was a 1967 graduate of Granville Wells High School and joined the Air Force following high school where he served four years with a tour of Duty in Vietnam from 1968-1969.
