Mr. Byron Eugene "Bud" Smith, 74, of Lebanon, passed away Thursday night, September 17, 2015 at St. Vincent Heart Center in Indianapolis. He was born in Lebanon, Indiana, on December 24, 1940, a son of the late William Donald and Juna Mae (Small) Smith.

A life-resident of Lebanon, he attended Lebanon High School. Following high school, Bud enlisted in the United States Marine Corp and served his country honorably from 1957 – 1959.

On November 3, 1962, he was married to Judith Kay "Judy" Smith, at the Assembly of God Church in Lebanon, Indiana. Mrs. Smith passed away September 4, 2013. They had spent 50 loving years together.
