



Duard L. Wyatt

July 24, 1924 - January 22, 2016

Mr. Duard L. Wyatt, 91, went home to be with his Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ, on Friday, January 22, 2016, at his son's home in Lebanon, Indiana. He was born in Sturgis, Michigan, on July 24, 1924, a son of the late Lyndon and Clara (Baldy) Wyatt.

Mr. Wyatt graduated from Otsego High School in Otsego, Michigan, in 1942 and was awarded a music scholarship to Western Michigan University. In 1943, he enlisted in the United States Air Force and served his country honorably during World War II. He later earned a B.A. degree in Bible from Bob Jones University. He then attended Conservative Baptist Theological Seminary in Denver, Colorado, and earned a Masters of Divinity degree. He earned a second Master's degree in Education from Butler University in 1962.

Mr. Wyatt taught a short time at Washington Township in Boone County. For more than 30 years he taught elementary students at Washington Township schools in Marion County. During the summers, Mr. Wyatt worked at Best Lock Corporation in Indianapolis. He taught in the evenings at Indiana Bible Institute in Indianapolis. After retiring from teaching, he worked part-time as a security guard at The Forum and volunteered many hours at Girls, Incorporated teaching and maintaining computers and software.

He married the love of his life, Viva Joan (Fisher) Wyatt on August 23, 1952 in

Lebanon, Indiana; she went home to her Savior on July 28, 1991.

He was a devoted father and loved spending time with family. He enjoyed books, flowers, birds, and playing the trumpet. He served as a Sunday School teacher, Interim Pastor, and other positions of church leadership his whole life.

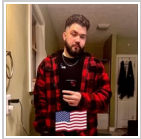
