Mrs. Edith J. Cline, 88, passed away on Tuesday, April 21, 2015, at Wesley Manor in Frankfort. She was born in South Wales, Great Britain, on January 25, 1927, the daughter of John Daniel and Ellen May (Salvidge) James.

At the age of 14, Edith left school and went to work. She was a cashier in a grocery store. On December 12, 1946, she came to the United States of America on the Queen Elizabeth. The great grandkids insisted that she came over on the Titanic, and always teased her "Why didn't you save Jack". She had come to the United States to marry her husband and live with his parents.

On December 18, 1946, she was married to John Franklin Cline, Jr. in Lebanon. Mr. Cline passed away on July 5, 2000.

While in Lebanon, Edith had worked at Glove-Boss Manufacturing Company for a little more than three years. She then went to work for Thorntown Textile and worked there from 1960 – 1980. She also worked at 3D Department Store.

She was a devoted wife, mother, grandmother, and great grandmother. She took great pride in her family and enjoyed knitting, mowing and playing cards at the Senior Citizens Center. Edith had been a member of the First Community Church of Lebanon since 1961. She also enjoyed volunteering

two hours each week at Boone County Senior Services.

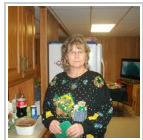

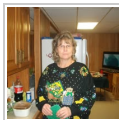
