



Harold K. LaCosse

Harold K. LaCosse, 90, of Morocco passed away on April 11, 2016. Harold, the son of Ira and Clara LaCosse, was a life-long resident of Newton County graduating from Mount Ayr High School in 1943. After briefly attending Purdue University, Harold was drafted into the Army and served his country in France and Germany during WW II. He was awarded both a Bronze and Silver Star. After the war, Harold attended Coyne Electrical School. Upon graduation, he opened a radio and television store in Morocco which he operated until retirement. He supported his children's activities with leadership positions in scouting and Rainbow. He supported the community as a volunteer fireman. Harold was a pilot who enjoyed Sunday flights for breakfast across northern Indiana and Illinois. Harold was an active member of the 63rd Infantry Division Association of World War II veterans for many years.

Harold was preceded in death by Donna Schanlaub LaCosse, his wife of nearly 66 years. They have three children: Roger (Linda) of Louisville, KY, Ron (Ann) of Lafayette, and Gina (Scott) Iseminger of Indianapolis, and one foster son Jeff (Annette) Iseminger of Morocco. Grandchildren are Damian Iseminger, Micah Iseminger, Danny LaCosse, Brandy LaCosse, Natasha Foster, Jennifer Kennedy, Bob LaCosse, Bill LaCosse, and Briann LaCosse. Foster grandsons are Derek Iseminger and Brock Iseminger. Grandson Jaman Iseminger preceded him in death. They have 19 great grandchildren. Surviving is his sister Joyce Cupp Padgett.
