Mr. Harold Wayne "Butch" Noe, 76, of Lebanon, passed away Friday, March 25, 2016 at St. Vincent Seton Specialty Hospital in Indianapolis, Indiana. He was born in Fortville, Indiana, on May 14, 1939, a son of the late George and Gladys Noe.

Raised in Fortville, Harold was a graduate of Fortville High School.
