Lois Ann Plawecki, 81, passed away at Witham Memorial Hospital in Lebanon, Indiana on March 16, 2018. She was born on March 18, 1936, in East Chicago, Indiana, a daughter of the late Harry and Mary (Duhon) Kosinski.

Before getting married to Dick Plawecki on October 7, 1961, she was a secretary at Inland Steel. The couple had three children: Jeff Plawecki, Karen Plawecki and Laura Starns. The family's first house was in Merrillville, Indiana before they moved to South Bend, Indiana in 1972. Lois then began working as a secretary at the Notre Dame Law School in 1975 where she remained until her retirement in 2004. Her work at Notre Dame was important in paying for the college education for each of her three children. Her friends at Notre Dame were very important to her as well. She truly valued her relationships there, especially with Marlou.

Lois enjoyed drawing, reading and crossword puzzles. She was always a great advocate for her kids and supported their activities such as Cub Scouts, Brownies, baseball, etc.

Twelve years ago, Lois suffered a stroke and heart attack at her home in South Bend. She moved to the Indianapolis area during her long recovery, so that Jeff and his wife, Lynne could assist her. She persevered and eventually

reached a full recovery before she began to show signs of dementia which she lived with for about the last four years of her life.

Lois had a great sense of humor, was self-deprecating, caring, and humble. She always wanted the best for others. She was fondly referenced as Lois Lips as she chose that moniker for many of her passcodes.

In addition to her three children, she is survived by four grandchildren.

Private Family Services will be held at Hoosier Village in Indianapolis on Friday, March 23, 2018. Myers Mortuary and Boone County Crematory have been entrusted with her care.
