



Rev. Lowell E. Spaulding

April 7, 1934 - February 11, 2017

Rev. Lowell Edward Spaulding, 82, passed away peacefully at his home in Lebanon on Saturday, February 11, 2017. He was born on April 7, 1934, in Hendricks County, Indiana, a son of Floyd Merle and Bessie Vera (Fredrich) Spaulding.

Lowell was raised in a home between Lizton and Jamestown, Indiana, graduating from Jackson Township High School in 1952. He then attended Indiana Baptist College and finished with an Associate Degree.

On July 3, 1954, he was married to Phyllis Mae (Martin) Spaulding at the Walnut Street Baptist Church in Lebanon. After 62 loving years together, Mrs. Spaulding survives.

Rev. Spaulding had resided in the Jamestown area, Lebanon, Frankfort for 15 years and had moved to Pittsboro in 1980. He began his ministerial career at a church in Frankfort and then pastored at the Walnut Street Baptist Church in Lebanon from 1999 to the end of 2013. Prior to becoming a minister, Lowell had worked for various companies including Allison Division of General Motors, Royal Cleaners, Dolly Madison, National Seal, MicroPoise and Kamplain Machine.

Lowell was a loving and devoted, husband, father, grandfather, and great

grandfather. Rev. Spaulding had a friendly and outgoing personality, he was well known in the community and loved by his church family. He will be sadly missed by all who knew him.

Visitation will be held at Walnut Street Baptist Church, 225 East Walnut Street, in Lebanon, from 4:00 to 7:00 p.m. on Wednesday, February 15, 2017.

Funeral Services planned for Thursday, February 16, 2017, at 10:30 a.m. at the church in Lebanon.
