Wayne Lee Chambers, 73, of Thorntown, Indiana, passed away on Wednesday, December 09, 2015 at Riverwalk Village in Noblesville, Indiana. He was born in Indianapolis, Indiana on August 9, 1942, the son of the late Bernard Chambers and Thelma (Gaither) Chambers-Badger.

On September 16, 1964 he married Lynn (Silvey) Chambers in Otterbein, Indiana; she survives.

Wayne was a graduate of Howe High School and had attended Tech High School, John Herrin School of Art and IUPUI in Indianapolis. After high school he joined the U. S. Navy and served his country with honor for six years.
